One neat resource Darryl provides is Mini Miners Monthly. Now in its fifth year, it's the periodical about minerals written specifically for young collectors. Throughout the year, it brings kids interesting articles at a level they can appreciate about minerals, crystals, and mineral collecting, along with fun activities like crossword puzzles, word searches, cut-andfold crystal models, and coloring pages. features interviews with important mineral collectors of our day and suggestions on how to build and take care of a collection. welcomes mineral art, photography, and articles by kids themselves.

For the past two years, CFMS has purchased electronic subscriptions to *Mini Miners Monthly* for all CFMS societies with an active youth program. As announced and approved by the Directors at our November meeting in Visalia, CFMS will be extending the subscription for another two years, but with a bonus. When we started talking about extending the subscription, Darryl made just one demand: that we pay the same amount as before, but that we provide the subscription to *all CFMS societies*. A pretty gracious "demand," by any standard, and our sincere thanks to Darryl for this generous arrangement!

Darryl is working with Pat LaRue and Merryan O'Neill to compile email addresses from our CFMS directory of local societies so that he can start emailing an electronic copy of *Mini Miners Monthly* each month to each club. Let this serve as a reminder to all clubs to make sure your

CFMS directory info is complete, accurate, and upto-date! The best person to receive the subscription in a club is either the junior's program leader or the newsletter editor.

With the electronic subscription, clubs receive permission to reproduce a reasonable amount of material from each issue (4 or 5 pages) in their newsletters, on their web sites, and/or as handouts at club meetings with kids. CFMS is underwriting these subscriptions with the goal of encouraging clubs to grow their kids' programs, providing them with good material to use, and encouraging our children in the pursuit of the earth sciences as a hobby and potentially as a career.

We did not get rocks from 6 of the National Forests in California: Inyo NF, Los Padres NF, Lassen NF, Six Rivers NF, San Bernardino NF, and Sierra NF. I would like to complete our collection so that we have specimen rocks from *ALL* of the California National Forests. Please check your memory and your rock piles for sample rocks from these forests. You can give or send them to me anytime over the next few months or at the CFMS Convention in July.

#### Adding Value to Society Membership

Those of us who have attended Camp Paradise and/or Zzyzx fully appreciate the phenomenal value of these Earth Science Studies Camps.

One very popular method of adding value to membership in your society would be to hold an annual drawing for a 1-week attendance at either of these two camps with the cost (excluding travel and incidentals) to be paid entirely by your society.

One society that has done this for several years holds its annual drawing in conjunction with its Christmas Dinner/Installation of Officers – a perfect time for giving! The rules are simple: 1) only adult/non-honorary members are eligible, 2) prior awardees are not again eligible, 3) awardees must continue to be members in good standing in the year of attendance and 4) attendees are required to provide a brief program at a society meeting after attending Camp Paradise/Zzyzx to relate their experiences and display their handiwork.

If your society doesn't already have such a program established, please have your Board of Directors give this serious consideration. It's a great value to your membership!

As winter comes to an end with spring just around the corner it's time to plan field trips to those favorite collecting sites. As planning activities progress, keep in mind that those who are making plans to restrict access to collecting sites are still very active. The second half of the 112<sup>th</sup> congress has begun its session and there are many bills being considered to restrict or eliminate access to some favorite collecting sites.

These sites are the Rockhounds to lose. Being complacent and not taking an active role in the legislative process can only lead to the closure of access to some of the best Rockhound collecting sites in the CFMS Region.

How do you become a Rockhound Activist? Be vigilant, stay informed on the issues and take action by contacting your elected official responsible for making the decisions in both Sacramento and Washington DC.

How is that accomplished? There are several ways to stay informed.

1. Contact your local Club or Society's Federation Representative; they will know where to get current information that is available through the Regional Federation.

- 2. Contact either of the CFMS PLAC Chairmen; their contact information is available on the CFMS Website www.cfmsinc.org.
- 3. Visit the American Lands Access Association's dynamic website for the latest information available that has effect on Public Land Access <a href="https://www.amlands.org">www.amlands.org</a>.
- 4. Attend public meetings of the USFS and BLM when they are in your area and make the voice of the Rockhound be heard. Just by being in attendance and signing in at the meeting shows Rockhounds have interest and concern in the Public Land Management Process.

Currently, the collecting sites are the Rockhounds to loose and voicing opinions and concerns are the only way to keep the collecting sites open and accessible to all.

So, keep active in the pursuit of those elusive agates, jaspers, minerals and fossils and stay informed in what is happening to the Public Lands that are so enjoyable to all of their users.

## Simple Steps Help Prevent Household Fires

Ever left the house when the clothes dryer was running? Or stepped away from the stove while something was simmering? If so, you're not alone.

In Liberty Mutual's recent fire safety survey, household appliances were among the concerns cited most often and the above were the two most frequent causes of home fires. To prevent those and other common hazard, follow these simple steps:

- \*\*Discontinue using any appliance that overheats. Do the same if an appliance shorts out, smokes, sparks or emits odd smells.
- \*\*Make sure all appliance cords are in good condition. Don't use an appliance with a worn, damaged or frayed cord.
- \*\*Clean your clothes dryer's lint tray with every use.
- \*\*Have your gas-powered dryer professionally inspected once a year. This will help prevent fires and contribute to the dryer's energy efficiency.
- \*\*Keep flammable items away from the stove. Pay particular attention to potholders and towels.
